


MOTION


Dr David Richardson moved to elect the Board nominations. Dr Jason Kliiger seconded, all in favour. Carried.



"Listening to membership and our partners to work on solutions and improvements and health care in partnership with the health authorities. Keeping Members connected so that they continue in healthy practice."




